About 350

Less than three years ago 350.org and 350 Aotearoa were launched with a mission to inspire the world to rise to the challenge climate change presents —to create a new sense of urgency and of possibility for our planet and future.

350 comes from 350 parts per million of CO₂ in the atmosphere - the level scientists say we need if we want to maintain the world as we currently know it. (Due to the burning of fossil fuels the world is currently at 392ppm.)

About this role

We'll support you to learn new skills through training retreats and workshops, and also hope you can share your skills with us!

This is your chance to lead a regional group to take part in both local and global actions as part of the 350 movement. This role also offers personal and professional development opportunities.

Responsibilities

- Support and build a local 350 group (or groups) in your region
- Grow the 350 movement in your region (in numbers of supporters, volunteers and 350 groups)
- Oversee local campaigns

- Working out local response to national and global campaigns
- Raise funds for local projects
- Maintain communication (online and offline) with the regional group and between 350 Aotearoa and other regional groups
- Act as 350 Aotearoa's media spokesperson in the region, when needed
- Input into 350 Aotearoa Strategy
- Love volunteers!
